AMIDEAST Education Abroad Programs ARAB 302: Modern Standard Arabic VI Session 1 Syllabus

Credit Hours: 5 credit hours

Course Description

This course provides additional practice at the advanced level to help students attain a higher level skill of development (e.g., listening, speaking, reading and writing) and linguistic accuracy in Modern Standard Arabic. The teaching and learning process in this course is communication-based and the emphasis is placed more on context rather than grammatical rules. At this level, the student is more autonomous and responsible for his/her own learning, preparing texts, explaining vocabulary and summarizing. The course provides students with the opportunity to examine in depth Arabic cultural heritage, Arab world politics, women's issues and sustainable development concerns. Students are required to watch TV broadcasts of cultural, historical and religious programs, analyze more complex texts and present their analysis orally in class, and engage in lengthy discussions with other classmates. This course covers the material in *Al-Kitaab*, Part Three, Second Edition, Chapters 1-5, with local supplementary materials.

Learning Outcomes

By the completion of this course, students will be able to:

- Understand essential grammatical rules and structures in MSA
- Converse in Arabic using a variety of language functions appropriate for their level
- Acquire knowledge about major aspects of Arabic and Islamic world culture.

Knowledge

By the completion of the course, students will:

- Expand their vocabulary to include words that allow them to read, listen, speak and write about topics of professional interest
- Research topics in order to discover an author's point of view and to seek evidence to support other points of view
- Apply grammatical knowledge as one of the analytical tools in comprehending reading texts
- Produce lengthy descriptive and argumentative discourse in speaking
- Summarize texts and express their points of view in writing and speaking
- Write about a variety of topics with precision and detail
- Interact with native speakers and engage in discussions of contemporary issues.

Skills

This course is designed to assist students in developing the following skills:

- Summarizing and commenting on assigned texts, Arabic TV programs, interviews, lectures, and documentaries.
- Following segments of Arabic programs (interviews, short lectures on familiar topics and news items and reports primarily dealing with factual information)
- Comprehending the main points in video materials accompanying the textbook and being able to identify important subtitles
- Employing a variety of strategies appropriate for different types of reading (skimming, scanning, reading for detail, reading for pleasure, etc.)
- Making substantial presentations on topics of interest.
- Writing lengthy compositions on current issues

Attitudes

This course helps develop the following attitudes:

- Eagerness to learn the Arabic language
- Curiosity about the local culture in particular
- Confidence in ability to interact with native speakers
- Cultural awareness to behave appropriately in various situations
- Desire to pursue further study of the language.

Engagement

Students are expected to attend all regularly scheduled classes and come prepared to participate fully in class activities. This means doing any listening activities, homework, and learning new vocabulary and structure so that they can actively use them in class.

Overview of Attendance Policy

For Modern Standard Arabic, students are allowed to miss only 4 contact hours (1 full day of instruction) unexcused before their overall grade is reduced. A student's grade for the course will be lowered by one "mark" for each additional unexcused absence (2 contact hours is equal to one absence). Being absent for more than 4 contact hours will result in one letter grade deduction from the student's final grade for every 2 hours of unexcused absence beyond the allowed limit. In other words, if a student misses an additional 2 hours of instruction (for a total of 6 hours of unexcused absences) an "A" will become "A-", after 8 total hours of unexcused absence an "A" becomes a "B"; after 10 total hours of unexcused absence an "A" becomes a "B", etc.; etc.

For Colloquial Arabic, students are allowed to miss only 2 contact hours unexcused before their overall grade is reduced. A student's grade for the course will be lowered by one "mark" for each additional unexcused absence (1 contact hour is equal to one absence). Being absent for more than 2 contact hours will result in one letter grade deduction from the student's final grade for every 1 hour of unexcused absence beyond the allowed limit. In other words, if a student misses an additional 1 hour of instruction (for a total of 3 hours of unexcused absences) an "A" will become "A-", after 4 total hours of unexcused absence an "A" becomes a "B+"; after 5 total hours of unexcused absence an "A" becomes a "B", etc.; etc.

An unexcused absence is one not caused by illness or otherwise not approved by AMIDEAST staff. An excused absence means written approval from the Program Manager (and sometimes a doctor) justifying the absence. Arriving late to class may also count towards an absence.

The engagement grade will depend on both the quality and the quantity of student's comments and questions and shall account for 20% of the total course grade.

Summary of Attendance Policy

- 1. Students are expected to do the required reading before class, volunteer for presentations and participate actively in class discussions.
- 2. Excused absences are determined by the lead AMIDEAST staff member; in some instances a doctor's certification may be required.
- 3. Deadlines must be respected, even in cases of excused absences.
- 4. Students are responsible for getting homework assignments they miss and submitting them in a timely manner. Assignments turned in after the due date will result in a penalty to be determined by the instructor.
- 5. Any assignments not submitted will result in that assignment being given a grade of 0 (zero).
- 6. The Attendance Policy is applied until the last day of the program.

<u>Assignments</u>

There will be daily assignments due at the beginning of class on the day assigned by the instructor. Late homework assignments may be checked by the instructor but will not be given any credit. Students are encouraged to study and work on homework assignments together. Students should follow up on any instructor's comments on the homework, and it is the students' responsibility to come to office hours to see the instructor when questions arise.

Research Paper

- By Week 4, Monday, students should submit a draft of the paper to their instructors.
- The instructors will highlight the mistakes and give the students the papers back for corrections.

Midterm Exam

The midterm exam will cover material studied from the beginning of the semester up until the midterm. It will test reading, writing and listening skills.

Final Written Exam

The final examination will cover material studied after the midterm. It will test reading, writing and listening skills.
